Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Our music curriculum is informed by Charanga. It is well planned and sequenced to fulfil the requirements set out in the national curriculum.

Music is taught in all year groups throughout the year. We also provide opportunities for children to focus on a specific instrument in Year 4.

We use the services of Services for Education Music Service who provide a specialist teacher to teach the instruments in year 4.

Children are also exposed to a wide range of different styles, genres, origins, artists, historical periods and so on using <u>'Song a Day'</u> Musical Genres Calendar.

Part B: Extra Curricular Music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

We offer the opportunity for our children to learn to play the guitar in year 4.

We also have an after-school choir club.

Part C: Musical experiences

Those children learning an instrument showcase their learning in end of term concerts for children and parents. Children also perform a song during their termly year group parent showcases.
